Students - your firm must be ready to present your design to a panel of mentors and guests for review and comment. The following must be 80%-100% complete for this review:

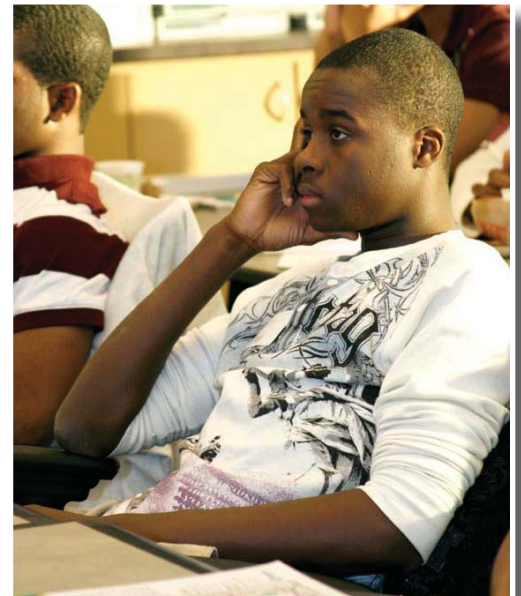
- Site plan or landscaping plan

Last year's ACE project was based on the Atlanta BeltLine so some of our veteran ACE students were already familiar with the BeltLine. We were delighted to learn more about the BeltLine - why is it important, what has been done so far, and what is proposed for the future. The students also learned how they could get involved in this project that may affect the communities in which they live and study.

Presentation, thanked and recognized our students for their great behavior. He then turned over the presentation to Paul Black. Paul talked about the current transportation and congestion challenges facing our city, and discussed how the BeltLine will alleviate some of these problems, improve the quality of life for Atlanta's inhabitants, connect our communities and ultimately create a healthier, more vibrant and attractive city.

The BeltLine presentation detailed key elements such as parks and arboretum, trails, transit infrastructure, jobs and economic development, affordable workforce housing, historic preservation, streetscapes and public art, and environmental clean-up. Every single element on this list fits into the scope of the professions that our ACE students are exploring through this program.

## Ask & Tell the BeltLine

We were very impressed by the number and quality of questions our students had for Rob and Paul. We could tell that our students were paying attention, considering the information presented since their questions were very perceptive and interesting. Sample questions from the student audience included: "What is affordable housing - what is affordable to one person may not be affordable to another?" "Will all the transit be electric or some other technology?" "Will the BeltLine connect to the Atlanta University Center?"

Rob and Paul also asked the students for their feedback on their PowerPoint presentation. Thank you to all the students for their honest feedback!
